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

Change in Mileage Reimbursement

The Internal Revenue Services has <u>increased</u> mileage reimbursement from 53.5 cents per mile to <u>54.5 cents per mile</u> starting January 1st. Please adjust your mileage reimbursement forms accordingly.

RULE REVIEWS

ORC 5103.0326 Non-renewals of Foster Care License

Please Note that Mahoning County Children Services may choose to recommend that ODJFS not renew a foster home certificate if the foster family has refused to accept a placement during the current certification period. ODJFS may also revoke a certification of the foster caregiver if they have not provided placement for a child during the preceding 12 month period.

5101:2-42-67 Preparation of lifebook.

** See attachment of chapter 7 from your foster parent manual for *required* Lifebook information. Foster parents are required to maintain updated lifebooks throughout a child's time in fostercare.

(A) When a child remains in substitute care for longer than six months, the public children services agency (PCSA) or private child placing agency (PCPA) shall begin to prepare a lifebook. The lifebook shall be updated every six months so long as the child remains in substitute care and shall include, but not limited to, the following information:

(B) The PCSA or PCPA may prepare a lifebook for a child sooner than six months after the child's placement.

(C) The PCSA or PCPA shall ensure that the lifebook is shared with the child during the placement, as appropriate to the child's age and understanding, and the lifebook should accompany the child when a placement move occurs and when the child is leaving substitute care .

(D) The PCSA or PCPA shall not place identifying information, as defined in rule <u>5101:2-1-01</u> of the Administrative Code, in the lifebook. The child may add identifying information to the lifebook.

(F) If a child in the permanent custody of a PCSA or PCPA is placed for adoption, the lifebook shall be given to the child and a copy shall be maintained in the child's record.

CPR / FIRST AID TRAINING

CPR/FIRST AID Requirement

Remember to register for adult/infant/child CPR and First Aid once every recertification period. This is a COA requirement for your foster care license.

FOSTERPARENTCOLLEGE.COM

Online foster parent training for foster, adoptive and kinship parents. These interactive courses provide valuable information, insights and advice from experts on dealing with serious child behavior problems such as eating disorders, fire setting, lying, etc.

Trainings are self directed and are completed online by the foster parent. Courses are about 45-60 minutes if you are using high speed internet, followed by an interactive question and answer section. Many courses include supplemental reading materials as "handouts". When you finish viewing the course and answering the review questions, you will receive a Certificate of Completion, which the foster parent can print out or forward to their agency foster care coordinator. Discussion boards are also available for any course, to share experiences and thoughts with others.

Each Foster Parent College course is good for two (2) training hours. Foster parents can have up to 12 hours (or 6 Foster Parent College courses) "out-of-classroom" training each re-certification period.

Foster parents need to register through the NEORTC Foster Parent Training Program. To register, please contact Vickie Webb at 330-379-1935 or email at webby@summitkids.org to register. Foster parents need to give their name, the county they are from and an email address. Each foster parent must have their own individual email address. After registration, foster parents will receive a welcome email message from Foster Parent College with a password and information on how to access Foster Parent College.

THIS TRAINING IS FREE OF CHARGE TO FOSTER PARENTS.

Foster Parent College course topics include: Anger Pie, Children with Autism, Childhood Anxiety Disorders, ADHD, Self Harm, Stealing, Running Away, Wetting or Soiling, Sexualized Behavior, Sleep Problems, Lying, Fire Setting, Anger Outbursts, Eating Disorders, Grief and Loss, Positive Parenting, House Safety, Working with Schools, Kinship Care, Working with Birth Parents.

TRAINING REMINDER

Please make sure that when you attend a training to sign in and name the agency/county where you are from, otherwise, you may not get credit

REMINDER PLEASE DO NOT BRING CHILDREN TO TRAININGS

You can earn up to 3 credit hours for reading a book; however; you must contact your licensing worker for a book review outline that is required for training credit. You can also earn 3 training hours by watching Despicable Me, Juno, Like Dandelion Dust or Meet the Robinsons and completing the movie guide. You can contact your licensing worker about getting the movie guide. Movies can be rented from your local video store, Redbox, Netflix or your local library

SIPS ask your licensing worker for SIPS.

These are supplements to help with completion of a minimal amount of training hours. Each SIPS can only be completed once.

Online addresses: <u>www.fosterparentcollege.com</u>, <u>www.fosterparent.com</u> and <u>www.fosterclub.com</u>. Webinars are also a great way to get your hours. Akron Children's Hospital offers many informative webinars regarding children's health issues. Please note that you can earn up to 12 hours in a 2 year time frame by reading a book, watching a movie, doing SIPS, or going online.

Please remember that your 40 hours of ongoing training is due *no later than 30 days* prior to your license expiration date.
