Change in Mileage Reimbursement

The Internal Revenue Services has <u>increased</u> mileage reimbursement from 53.5 cents per mile to <u>54.5 cents per mile</u> starting January 1st. Please adjust your mileage reimbursement forms accordingly.

Emergency List

RULE REVIEWS

Important things to remember when you are on the Emergency List or are considering becoming an Emergency Placement:

- Must answer the phone or return call to the agency representatives
- Must notify agency immediately if you are not able to continue to be on the Emergency Placement List
- Must take children sight unseen. A gentle reminder that when you are on emergency, take whatever steps you feel necessary to be sure you hear your phone all times day and night. While we realize everyone is busy, it is important to know that we are trying to get a child to the safest placement as quickly as possible and by not answering the phone or by saying "no", you are impeding the placement of a child.
- Placements are often made in the dark. Be sure your house is well lit and marked to make it easier for workers to find.
- Reimbursement for an emergency placement is \$60 per day for the first 30 days, then it goes to a regular rate.
- Have car seats and beds available for children you are agreeing to accept on emergency.

CPR / FIRST AID TRAINING

CPR/FIRST AID Requirement

Remember to register for adult/infant/child CPR and First Aid once every recertification period.

This is a COA requirement for your foster care license.

AGENCY POLICY UPDATES

The agency has developed a "Reasonable and Prudent Parent Standard" Policy which will be effective April 1, 2018. This is required by OAC Rule 5101:2-5-33(2)(a)(xiii)

A copy of the RPPS Policy is attached for your review. Please contact your licensing worker with any questions.

The babysitting reimbursement rate has been \$2/hour for years and years. Great news! It has now increased to \$3/hour! For those of you who use babysitters for childcare while you work, this should make your sitters very happy! You will continue to use the babysitter invoice for reimbursement as usual. If you have any questions, please contact your licensing worker.

TRAINING REMINDER

Please make sure that when you attend a training to sign in and name the agency/county where you are from, otherwise, you may not get credit

REMINDER PLEASE DO NOT BRING CHILDREN TO TRAININGS

You can earn up to 3 credit hours for reading a book; however; you must contact your licensing worker for a book review outline that is required for training credit. You can also earn 3 training hours by watching *Despicable Me, Juno, Like Dandelion Dust* or *Meet the Robinsons* and completing the movie guide. You can contact your licensing worker about getting the movie guide. Movies can be rented from your local video store, Redbox, Netflix or your local library.

SIPS ask your licensing worker for SIPS.

These are supplements to help with completion of a minimal amount of training hours. Each SIPS can only be completed once.

Webinars are also a great way to get your hours. Akron Children's Hospital offers many informative webinars regarding children's health issues. Please note that you can earn up to 12 hours in a 2 year time frame by reading a book, watching a movie, doing SIPS, or going online.

Please remember that your 40 hours of ongoing training is due <u>no later than 30 days</u> prior to your license expiration date.

Local Woman's Blanket Ministry Comforts Children in Foster Care

Wanda Marland's mission is all about blanketing individuals and children in need with comfort.

In 2005, Wanda created "The Comfort Blanket Ministry" to comfort individuals and children who are experiencing difficult life situations by giving them a comfort blanket. Many of the blankets donated are beautiful hand-sewn quilts (like the one pictured).

Wanda has literally "blanketed" the Mahoning Valley with comfort. Her Comfort Blanket Ministry has reached many local agencies such as The Rescue Mission, Protestant Family Services, Akron Children's Hospital, Sojourner House. Her blanket ministry has also gone international with comfort blankets sent to Russian orphans and to missionaries in Spain and India!



Three years ago, Wanda expanded her blanket ministries to include more local children. She is now working with Mahoning County Children Services to provide special "Birthday Bags" for children in foster care. Each month and throughout the year, Wanda will ensure that each child in foster care will receive a Birthday Bag on their birthday filled with a special comfort blanket and other age-appropriate items or toys.
